Dear Hunting Ridge Parents and Guardians,

As I write this article, it is a beautiful autumn day. I hope that you are all enjoying this wonderful warm weather! The Beautification Committee had a perfect day Saturday to do some planting and pull the weeds. I'd like to thank Mr. and Mrs. Chalmers and all the families that came over that day and worked so hard to make our school look great! Also, I'd like to thank Mrs. Millar and her committee for sponsoring the International Walk to School Day. Many of our students walked and rode bicycles that day, and were given stickers from Mayor Schwantz, Interim Superintendent Thompson, Board of Ed member Mr. Millar, Police Officer Holtz, PTA parents and me. What a great way to stay healthy! Thank you to all the parents on the many committees at Hunting Ridge for the hard work you have done so far this year!

If you have a child in grades 2-6, you have received his/her MAP results. This assessment is given in the areas of reading, math and language usage. This is a great diagnostic tool for teachers, as it shows them the instructional levels of the students and a breakdown of areas where students are performing. Many students are aware of their strengths and weaknesses and are working to improve their weak areas! This year, the reports went home in envelopes that will be reused for future results. Please sign and return the envelopes as you do for report cards. Thank you!

PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention Strategies) is in full swing and doing very well! This year not only are individual students getting "Huntleys" for exhibiting one of our Hawk Habits of being helpful, showing respect, and using kind words, but classrooms going above and beyond these expectations are getting "Golden Huntleys." Once a month we draw a Golden Huntley, and the winning class gets a 20 minute extra recess with Mrs. Mitchell and/or me. The September winner was Mr. Romano's class. We are finding that this program is very beneficial in helping to decrease negative behaviors.

Halloween is quickly approaching and you will soon be receiving a separate letter regarding the day's festivities. What Parents Need To Know About Homework

Northwest Suburban Council PTA/PTSA and staff from Community Consolidated School District 15 presented a free program for parents on **Homework Motivation and Tips for Parents** to Support a Successful Year for their Children on September 27.

Homework helps students to develop and refine intellectual skills and helps to develop independent learners. Good homework has a clear academic purpose and is well organized, easy to understand, and not overly tedious. The PTA, NEA and District 15 guidelines recommend the "10-minute" rule, which is a maximum of 10 minutes per grade level per night (Grade 6 = 60 minutes) on all subjects combined. Exceptions include out-of-level subject areas (i.e., math).

Talk with your child about your expectations and why homework is important. Help your child with organization and empower your child to take ownership of the homework process. Remember to praise their efforts!

Nutritious November

This small sample is a great way to introduce your child to a healthy food they might not have tried before. Of course, children can opt out of trying this new food, but we hope they give it a try. (Please note: sample item may change based on purchase availability.)

Get Some Sleep

Children today are losing sleep. Many are up late because they are overscheduled with homework and after-school activities, over stimulated with screen time from TV, computers, video games and cell phones or just have a lax bedtime. Kids rarely complain about it. In fact, they usually try to stall and push bedtime later, but signs will show. Sleep-deprived children have difficulty falling asleep at night and waking up in the morning. They can be irritable, have a short temper, have trouble concentrating, and may become hyperactive and uncooperative. Teens may show signs of anger or depression.

Lack of sleep impairs attention, alertness, memory and problem-solving skills making it difficult to learn efficiently. In fact, studies show that even losing one hour of sleep significantly affects academic performance and results in poorer test scores than students who get the recommended amount of sleep for their age. Lack of sleep also puts kids at an increased risk for obesity. Sleep affects the levels of appetite-regulating hormones, including leptin which signals satiety and ghrelin which stimulates hunger. Without enough sleep, the appetite is stimulated and cravings for high fat and high carbohydrate foods go up. Kids who spend time at night surfing the internet or watching TV close to bedtime may have a difficult time getting to sleep. The bright screens delay melatonin production and the necessary drop in core body temperature that naturally happens before we fall asleep.

Sleep is critical to the children's developing brains and bodies. During deep sleep the body can repair and regenerate tissue, build bone and muscle, consolidate memories, and strengthen the immune system to fight off colds and flu. Getting enough sleep is as important as eating right and getting enough exercise.

How much sleep do kids need?

Toddlers (age 1-3 years)	12-14 hours
Preschoolers (age 3-5 years)	11-13 hours
School age (5-10 years)	10-11 hours
Adolescents (10-17 years)	8 ½-9 ¼ hours

Tips to get better sleep

- Get regular exercise during the day, play outside
- Wake up and get to bed at the same time every day, even on weekends
- Avoid caffeine (cola, chocolate, coffee and tea) during the afternoon and evening
- Eat an evening snack containing carbohydrates and tryptophan such as milk (helps make serotonin to promote healthy sleep)
- Start a relaxing bedtime routine (no screen time) about 1 hour before bedtime
- Keep bedroom dark, cool, comfortable and quiet
- Keep TVs, computers, video games, and cell phones out of the bedroom
