Please consider giving some of your time and sharing a talent for a fun afternoon!

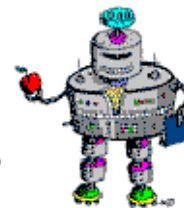

Clean Hands, Healthy Kids

Did your kids seem to catch every cold that went around last year? During cold and flu season, American children will catch, on average, 6-10 colds. The CDC reports a combined loss of 22 million days of school each year due to the common cold alone. Although colds are not related to exposure to cold weather, they are more prevalent during the colder months because people are inside more often and in close contact with each other. Germs can live for hours to days on door knobs and other surfaces like desks and computer keyboards. Children may touch a contaminated surface and touch their faces or eat their snack before washing hands, exposing themselves to germs that cause colds, flu and stomach viruses. One of the simplest and most effective ways to prevent the spread of germs is hand washing.

Teach Children Proper Hand Washing

Wash with soap and warm water (anti-bacterial soap is not necessary, but just plain water doesn't cut it)
Scrub well for 20 seconds (try it...It's longer than you think)
Try singing the ABC song while washing to help kids time it
Scrub under fingernails and jewelry too
Rinse with warm water
Dry with a paper towel
If a sink is not available (like in the car), the CDC recommends alcohol-based hand sanitizer

When to Wash

Before eating snacks and meals or preparing food
After visiting the restroom or changing diapers
Before touching eyes, nose, or mouth
After sneezing, blowing your nose, or coughing
After playing outside
After arriving home from school
After visiting someone who is sick
After touching animals or pets
When hands are visibly dirty

More Healthy Habits

Cover sneezes and coughs - Remind children to sneeze into a tissue and cough into their elbow.

Don't touch your face - Teach children to never touch their eyes, nose or mouth unless they have washed their hands first.

Drink plenty of fluid - Adequate hydration keeps mucous membranes moist and functioning properly.

Eat healthy food with nutrients to strengthen the immune system - Foods that contain Vitamins A, C, and E, Zinc, Copper and Selenium for a super-charged immune system include brightly colored fruits and vegetables, nuts and seeds, lean meats and fish.

Eat yogurt - Probiotics can help keep the immune system healthy and studies show it reduces susceptibility to colds.

Exercise regularly - Exercising for 20-30 minutes increases natural virus-killing cells.

Avoid second-hand smoke - Smoke can paralyze the cilia that trap and sweep dust and germs out of the lungs.

Get enough sleep - A good night's sleep increases resistance to infections.

Pizza Hut Book It Completes its First Month at Hunting Ridge!

We are excited to announce that the Pizza Hut Book It, a national reading incentive program sponsored by Pizza Hut and offered by the Hunting Ridge PTA, achieved its first milestone!!!! The response from the students was tremendous. The Reading calendars for the month of October were turned in and the students received their Pizza Hut Book It awards.

This is an optional reading program designed to motivate children to read more and to develop a regular reading routine at home. At Hunting Ridge it runs from October to December. The reading goal for each month is 300 minutes minimum. Students can read on their own or be read to by a family member. Only reading done at home is taken into consideration. The students have to color the days on the calendar when they read for 20 minutes or more! At the end of the month they have to total the minutes. If they meet the goal of 300 minutes they have to get the calendar signed by their parents and return it to the classroom teacher. Each child who achieves the monthly reading goal receives a certificate for a free, one-topping personal pan pizza redeemable at any Pizza Hut restaurant. A child can earn only one certificate each month. Certificates are valid for one month from the date issued by the teacher.

The students are now reading to complete their goals for the month of November and we hope that everyone takes advantage of this opportunity to encourage our children to read more. This past month a committee was formed to take on the task of updating and revising our Hunting Ridge Bylaws and Standing Rules. Our Bylaws are the basic rules and procedures our PTA follows and contain structured and specific rules to make sure our organization runs smoothly. They also ensure our time and energy is well spent improving the education and life of our children. A lot of these laws have already been set in place by the Illinois PTA and are in accordance with the IRS standards to help us maintain our tax exempt status. We do, however, have some say in regards to how we run our Hunting Ridge PTA in areas such as membership, voting, duties of elected officers and committees.

A special thanks goes to Linda Millar and Lisa Neal for assisting me with this committee. We are currently awaiting approval from our district director in regards to the changes that were made. Once the adopted amendments have been approved, I will post them on our PTA board outside the school office. They will be publicly posted for 30 days so everyone has an opportunity to review them. From there I will present them to the General Membership for voting. This will most likely occur at our February 15, 2011 PTA meeting at noon in the Learning Resource Center. I encourage everyone who can attend to please come and vote in regards to these newly revised Bylaws!

On November 2, the voters of Palatine Township voted 2:1 not to authorize \$27 million of working cash bonds for District 15. The vote put to rest a controversial question surrounding funding. Battle of the Books is a reading competition for students in grades 3-6. All interested students will meet in the LRC on Thursday, December 2, 2010 during the recess/lunch hour. At that time permission slips will be given. Students will have one week to return the permission slips to Mrs. Nilsen or Mrs. Oltman. (No late slips will be accepted!) Once the permission slips are collected, the teams are assigned by the coordinators. They will be comprised of students of multiple grades and abilities. The competitions are similar in style to the TV series Family Feud or Jeopardy. The teams will compete in four rounds of battle at Hunting Ridge. The winning team will be invited to participate in a district-level battle on April 30, 2010.

Navigate15:

Community and District for Educational Success

In a move to involve the full force of the community in decisions affecting the future direction of Community Consolidated School District 15, Superintendent Scott Thompson recently announced plans to hold a series of community meetings beginning November 16. A small team of staff and citizens will help plan and implement these meetings. The Facilitating Team has given the process a name: *Navigate15*. The name reflects the team's goal of using the engagement sessions to guide the future direction of Community Consolidated School District 15.

The task force will seek the opinions and insights of the entire community-parents, residents and business leaders. *Navigate15* hopes to open the lines of communication between the District and the communities it serves and will use that feedback to create connections resulting in meaningful recommendations for District 15.

Beginning on November 16 and continuing into the next year, individuals participating in *Navigate15* will study and discuss a variety of topics. *What do high performing school districts have that District 15 doesn't? What programs would improve student achievement in District 15 schools?* From facilities to finances to demographics to technology, *Navigate15* meetings will provide the information needed to make informed recommendations to the school board in August 2011.

Community involvement in *Navigate15* is vital to its success and the District has extended an open invitation to participate in the monthly meetings. Seven *Navigate15* meetings are scheduled from 7 to 9 p.m. on the following dates: November 16, 2010; January 18, February 15, March 22, May 3 and 31, and June 21, 2011. All meetings will be held at Winston Campus (900 E. Palatine Rd., Palatine) in the cafeteria.
